In the Old Testament, God revealed His name to Moses: **“I AM WHO I AM.”** This is what you are to say to the Israelites: **“I AM** has sent me to you” (Exodus 3:14).

From the Gospel of John

“I am the bread of life” (John 6:35, 41, 48, 51).

Jesus makes a statement about who He is, and He backs it up with something He does. In this case, Jesus states that He is the bread of life just after He had fed the 5,000 in the wilderness.

“I am the light of the world” (John 8:12; 9:5). Jesus heals a man born blind. Jesus not only says He is the light; He proves it.

“I am the door” (John 10:). This “I am” statement stresses that no one can enter the kingdom of heaven by any other means than Christ Himself.

“I am the good shepherd” (John 10:11, 14). With this “I am” statement, Jesus portrays His great love and care. He is the One who willingly protects His flock even to the point of death

“I am the resurrection and the life” (John 11:25). Jesus made this “I am” statement immediately before raising Lazarus from the dead.

“I am the way and the truth and the life” (John 14:6). This powerful “I am” statement of Christ’s is packed with meaning. Jesus is not merely one way among many ways to God; He is the only way.

“I am the true vine” (John 15:1, 5). We are the branches, and He is the vine. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit unless it is joined in vital union with the vine, only those who are joined to Christ and receive their power from Him produce fruit in the Christian life.
